5. Principals Report – Bob O'Connor

 - b. Discussion of late start implementation. Board voted for a late start, want it implemented by next year.
 - concerns are athletes missing school
 - concern by UDOT and City that certain intersections will fail during peak rush hour time – traffic coming and going will be difficult
 - propose zero hour 7:30
 - wait until grade level alignment?

6. 17/18 Membership - - Discussion of whether we should use efunds next year.
 - efunds is a perpetual problem, won't be fixed by next year
 - 33% went through efunds
 - PTSO up membership fees to cover fees

6. Discussion with Molly Miller, Communications Specialists for PCSD
 - late start: they want to make zero hour an option vs. the only time you can take a class
 - start time for elementary can't be before 7:50 am
 - school start times must be 60 minutes apart to accommodate bus times
 - Hired a transportation consultant to do bus studies (cost \$30-40K)
 - Board seemed open to make sure we take the time to do this right
 - Administration does support changing start times along with the alignment
 - 75% of students are involved in after school sports
