Community

Founded May 17, 1915, Park City School District is nestled in the mountains of the year-round resort town of Park City, Utah. The district's mission is to empower students to develop their knowledge, skills, and potential as critical thinkers.

There are four elementary schools (PreK-5), one middle school (grades 6-7), one junior high (grades 8-9), one alternative school (grades 9-12), and one high school (grades 10-12) in the Park City School District. Nearly 5,000 students attend Park City schools, including 20% Latinos, 8% English Language Learners, 7% with disabilities, and 22% free or reduced lunch.
