



Graduation progress and senior year planning

- **College-Prep Curriculum:** Is standard core high school graduation curriculum. During high school it's important to challenge yourself (within reason) with advanced coursework.

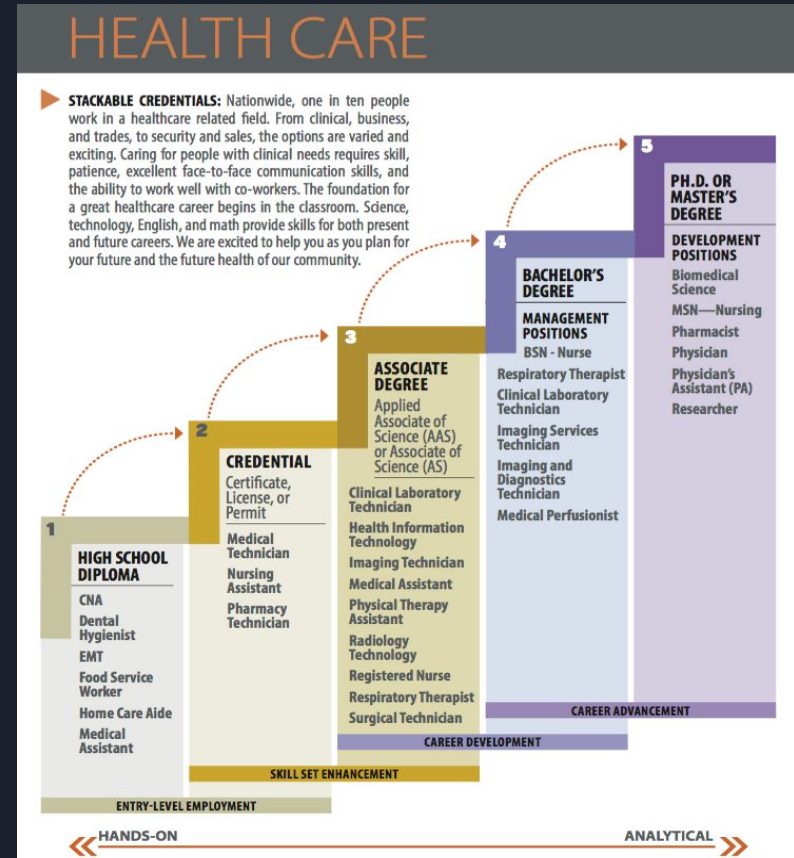

When planning for college it's important to remember that college is an investment of time and money. What is the best option for you?

- 1, 2, 4 or more
- College completion rates
- 15 to finish



What to look for when considering post secondary options

- What degrees/training options do they offer? (1, 2, 4 or more)
- What is their graduation rate/what support services do they offer? Career guidance or placement?
- What activities/involvements are available that you enjoy?
- Location, size, COST, and other factors.
- Admissions requirements - what classes do you need in HS? Selectivity- What average GPA/ACT do they admit?
- It's not about the name, it's about what's right for YOU and where you can be successful! (Remember the SKILLS)

Timeline of events (highlights)

Spring of Junior Year:

- Junior College Day: February 3rd
- ACT for all juniors at PCHS: March 23rd (morning)
- Registration for senior year: First week of March (English classes)
- Continue college/career research and begin to develop a list of colleges

Fall of Senior Year:

- Counselor presentations and CCR meetings (September)
- Take ACT/SAT one more time (if needed)
- Complete college applications (Nov-Jan, typical due dates)
- FAFSA (financial aid) and Scholarship applications
